Winter Wellness Tips
Worm Treatment



Worldwide, there are many worms that can infest the bowels of people, but most of them are not problems in Australia because of our climate and very good sanitation. Worms causing infection in people are parasites that live and breed mostly in the bowel (intestine). The most common worm in Australian children is the threadworm. Infection with other worms such as roundworms, hookworms and tapeworms are less common.

Symptoms of **threadworm** infection may include an itchy bottom, irritability and behavioural changes, but most people have no symptoms.

Worms can usually be eliminated with the correct treatment. Studies suggest that all family members should be given the worm treatment. This is to prevent Reinfection from another family member.

Treatment: Most worming tablets are available in a single dose tablet and can be purchased without a prescription. Change bed linen and underwear daily for several days after treatment. Normal hot water washing of clothes and bed linen will kill threadworm eggs.


Prevention: Make sure children wash their hands after using the toilet and before eating.

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to eat well and prevent disease.

Did you know that eating the right amount of fruit and veg can lower your risk of cancer by 5-12 percent? Yet most adults don't eat enough of either, particularly veg.




Try to add fruit and veg to every meal:

- Add chopped bananas or strawberries to your brekky cereal
- Add some sliced tomato on your toast
- Munch on some carrot or cucumber sticks at morning tea
- Add legumes like kidney beans or chickpeas to your salad at lunch

Remember! Aim for two serves of fruit, and five serves of vegetables – every day!
